High School Literature

Full Year Courses

American Literature and British Literature are offered every other year, alternating with each other.

They are non-sequential.

Recommended for grades 9-12

American Literature	British Literature
This course is based on Bob Jones' American Literature textbook and takes a year to complete because of the breadth of the material to be surveyed. This course looks at many authors during each era of our country's history, how history affects literature, and how literature both reflects and impacts the culture in which it is written. This class provides excellent preparation for the American Literature CLEP examination.	This course is based on Bob Jones' British Literature textbook and takes a year to complete because of the breadth of the material to be surveyed. This course covers English literature from its beginning to the present from a Christian worldview. Each literary era is viewed within its historical time frame and analyzed with regard to how history impacts literature and how literature both reflects and impacts culture. This class provides excellent preparation for the English Literature CLEP examination.

College Level

PSEO for 11th and 12th grade students

Introduction to Literary Analysis (2nd Semester)

Continued instruction and practice in writing and the writing process are the focal points of this course, with emphasis on critical analysis of literary genres.
